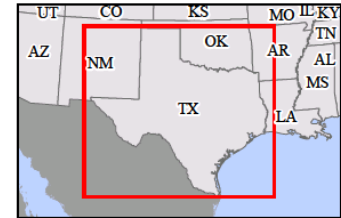
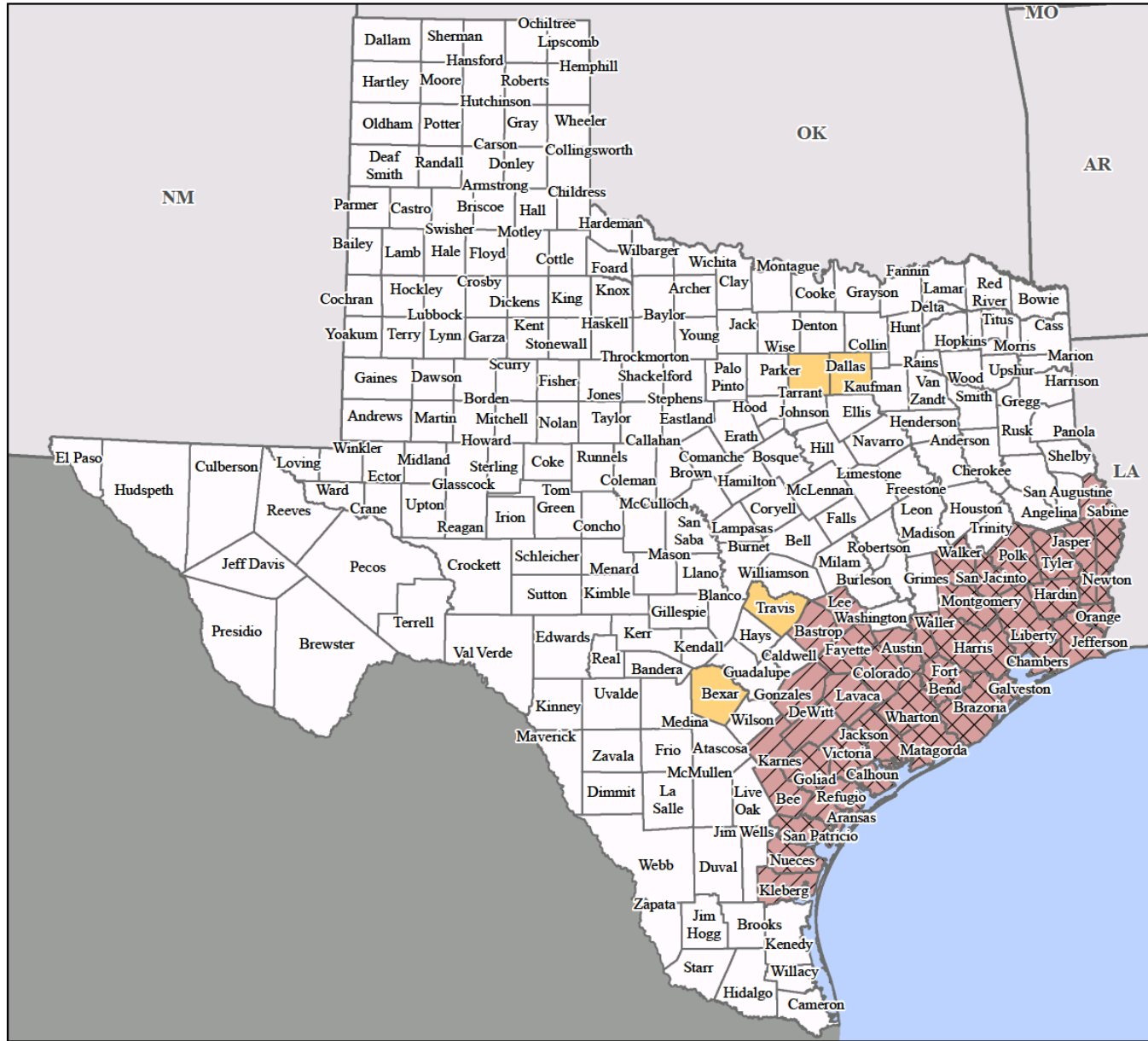
Relief Recipients

- *Individuals and organizations whose homes or businesses located in a FEMA or state-declared disaster area that were damaged or destroyed by Hurricanes Harvey*
 - Individuals with incomes at or below 165 percent of the Area Median Income (AMI)
 - Businesses located in communities in which the average family income is at or below 165 percent of the AMI
 - Businesses that will create jobs for individuals with incomes at or below 165 percent of the AMI

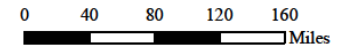
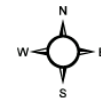


Data Layer/Map Description:

Disaster Relief Advance - Overview

- **Priced below CIP pricing**, which are already priced at a favorable interest rate
- **Advance terms of three months to 40 years available**
- Funds available through 5:00 p.m. (CT) **February 28, 2018**
- **DRP advances must be used to fund financing to a borrower or project; a copy of the original note must be submitted prior to funding**
- Member Limits
 - Community development advances (which include Disaster Relief Program, EDP, CIP and AHP advances) may not exceed, at the time the advance is approved, the lesser of 15 percent of an institution's total assets or \$200 million

Special Disaster Relief Advance - Overview

- How much money has the Bank made available?
 - \$1 billion
- What is the cost of this special DRP advance?
 - 1.05 percent
- What is the advance term?
 - Up to six months
- How long are funds available?
 - Through 5:00 p.m. (CT) December 15, 2017

Application Process

- Submit the applicable **application(s)** and supporting **documentation** to Member Services via email.

- Applications must be signed by an individual on the FHLB Dallas **Advances Signature Card**.
- After the request(s) is approved, the funds will be deposited into the members' FHLB Dallas **DDA account**.
